Student Focused Goals

- Reading Goal: By June 2024, Classical Charter Schools of Whiteville will Meet or Exceed reading growth and will increase overall reading proficiency by 5% from 40.5% to 45.5%, as measured by NC End-of-Grade testing.
- Math Goal: By June 2024, Classical Charter Schools of Whiteville will Meet or Exceed math growth and will increase overall math proficiency by 5% from 36.3% to 41.3%, as measured by NC End-of-Grade testing.
- <u>Science Goal</u>: By June 2024, Classical Charter Schools of Whiteville will Meet or Exceed math growth and will increase overall math proficiency by 5% from 57.4% to 62.4%, as measured by NC End-of-Grade testing.
- <u>Teacher Retention Goal</u>: Classical Charter Schools of Whiteville will work to close the teacher retention gap to within 5% of the Columbus County Schools LEA as indicated in the Teachers Leaving the Profession Data annual report.

A1.07: ALL teachers employ effective classroom management and reinforce classroom rules and procedures by positively teaching them.

Implementation Status: Limited Development October 19, 2020

Assigned to: Administration, Lead Teachers, Curriculum, MTSS Team, and Social Worker

Classical Charter Schools of Whiteville recognizes the need for teachers to demonstrate positive classroom management and reinforcement of classroom rules and procedures by positively teaching them. We have taken steps to aid teachers in the following classroom management guidelines and being proactive in addressing student's needs.

- 1. Weekly teacher observations and daily walk-throughs completed by administration and curriculum.
- 2. Strategies provided by school Social Worker, for specific student behavior.
- 3. Behavior referral to MTSS team to address undesirable behaviors.
- 4. Increase parent communication.
- 5. Provide professional development sessions with focus on classroom management.

When fully implemented the teachers at Classical Charter Schools of Whiteville will be able to demonstrate a positive classroom environment where each unique student's needs are addressed proactively, and classroom management guidelines are being followed.

The information we will provide are the following:

- 1. Teacher observations and feedback from administration, curriculum, and ABA specialist.
- 2. Visuals of classroom guidelines displayed in each classroom.
- 3. Training schedule for classroom management from administration.
- 4. Parent Communication log.
- 5. Data to support decreased classroom behaviors.

A2.04: Instructional Teams develop standards-aligned units of instruction for each subject and grade level.

Implementation Status: Full Implementation November 8, 2023

A4.01: The school implements a tiered instructional system that allows teachers to deliver evidence-based instruction aligned with the individual needs of students across all tiers.

A4.06: ALL teachers are attentive to students' emotional states, guide students in managing their emotions, and arrange for supports and interventions.

<u>Implementation Status</u>: Limited Development December 02, 2022

Assigned to: Administration, Social Worker

Classical Charter Schools of Whiteville recognizes the emotional needs and support for all students. Our highest priority is to ensure that all students feel safe and secure in their learning environment. We are taking steps to provide support and interventions for students to better manage their emotions.

- 1. Gather data using the school Discipline Log to assist with tracking the location/time of occurrences, severity of the infractions, and number of violations for each individual student.
- 2. Visual model for select students to aide in the communicating their emotional state to their teacher.
- 3. Intervention/Support provided for select students in the form of weekly check-ins, and social/emotional group lesson with the school social worker.
- 4. Professional development provided at the beginning of each school year for teachers and staff delivered by school social worker and/or outside psychologist.
- 5. Staff recognition for successful implementation of emotional needs and support plan.
- 6. Headmaster, Assistant Headmaster, Social Worker and 2 teachers will be trained in Mental Health First Aid.

When fully implemented the students at Classical Charter Schools of Whiteville will be able to state their emotional state in a more productive and safe manner.

The information we will provide are the following:

- 1. Decrease in Discipline Log entries for individual students.
- 2. Each classroom will have a visual model for students to use to communicate their emotional state.

A4.16: The school develops and implements consistent, intentional, and on-going plans to support student transitions for grade-to-grade and level-to-level.

Implementation Status: Full Implementation November 8, 2023

B1.03: A Leadership Team consisting of the principal, teachers who lead the Instructional Teams, and other professional staff meets regularly (at least twice a month) to review implementation of effective practices.

Implementation Status: Full Implementation November 8, 2023

B2.03: The school has established a team structure among teachers with specific duties and time for instructional planning.

<u>Implementation Status</u>: Limited Implementation November 8, 2023

Classical Charter Schools of Whiteville currently has a daily instructional schedule in place that allows teachers to have a set planning during daily resource time and after students have dismissed at the end of the day.

- 1. Teachers will complete a semi-annual survey to collect data on needed opportunities for planning.
- 2. Administration and curriculum will create meeting schedules that do not interrupt the provided planning time.
- 3. Monitor the current instructional schedule to determine if changes need to be made.

When fully implemented the teachers at Classical Charter Schools of Whiteville will have their entire allotted time to plan for instruction.

- 1. Data from semi-annual teacher surveys.
- 2. Copy provided of daily instructional schedule.

B3.03: The principal monitors curriculum and classroom instruction regularly and provides timely, clear, constructive feedback to teachers.

Classical Charter Schools of Whiteville recognize the urgency to utilize all resources available to provide high quality instruction for all learners to continue to make gains in student proficiency.

- 1. Math tutoring will be offered to students in grades 4th through 8th.
- 2. RTA Summer and Fall camps will be offered to students in grades 1st through 4th.
- 3. Grant Instructional Specialists will provide instruction to lower leveled learners for both reading and math core classes. Also, an additional afternoon intervention time will be taught to continue to close the learning gaps.
- 4. Curriculum will provide new material and platforms to address the current needs of students.

When fully implemented, student data will be analyzed to determine academic and proficiency growth.

- 1. Attendance and academic data for students that attended tutoring.
- 2. Proficiency data.

E1.06: The school regularly communicates with parents/guardians about its expectations of them and the importance of the curriculum of the home (what parents can do at home to support their children's learning).

Implementation Status: Limited Implementation November 08, 2023

Assigned to: Administration, Curriculum

Classical Charter Schools of Whiteville recognizes that regular communication with parents/guardians is essential to student success.

- 1. A math curriculum night will be planned to provide parents with resources to assist their child at home with math curriculum.
- 2. The Headmaster will send weekly communications to families regarding current and upcoming events and news.
- 3. Dean of Classical Humanities will hold an English I parent night.
- 4. Testing Coordinator will hold a BOG parent information session prior to EOG and BOG testing.

When fully implemented the parents will receive weekly calls providing them with updates and important information that is occurring at school. The math parent night will allow parents the opportunity to understand the curriculum that is being taught and how they can assist their learner at home.
